# **Director's Report**

Greetings from the Figge! The mission of bringing art and people together is at the very heart of the Figge Art Museum; and it is a mission powered by the continued support of our community and incredible community members, like you. This annual report is an opportunity for us to collectively reflect on and celebrate the many ways that-together-we fulfilled that mission during fiscal year 21-22. As a donor, member, and champion of arts and education, you made it possible for us to continue building bridges that connect people to art inside the museum and out in the community. Through our collaborations with over 200 partner organizations, we inspired, brought together, challenged, healed, and transformed so many by creating opportunities for children, teens, and adults to connect with and experience art.



Inside the museum, we worked with artists, museums, collectors, galleries, and foundations across the United States to present 23 diverse exhibitions that encouraged visitors to engage with issues relevant to our community and deepened their understanding of art and culture as well as each other. Among the exhibitions presented were those that gave long overdue recognition to artists Robert Blackburn, Doris Lee, and John Leslie Breck; those that focused on topical issues, such as the pandemic, mental health, dementia, the environment, and migration; and those that featured works from our ever-expanding permanent collection.

New partnerships with the Art Bridges Foundation and Warner Foundation provided dynamic, longterm loans that were strategically paired with our own artworks and complemented by thoughtful narrative input from Western Illinois University students to foster dialogue and elevate our collection galleries. These installations were further enhanced through our program pairings, including Family Days, studio classes, and other learning and engagement opportunities, which highlighted a wide range of perspectives and invited community participation.

Outside the walls of the museum, we continued our work to connect people to art by creating new opportunities for community members to access and experience art. This year, our educators provided art kits, activities, and lessons to 93 local schools, libraries, and hospitals as well as the juvenile detention center, homeless shelter, and other organizations across the Quad Cities. Your continued support of these free programs has allowed us to expand our reach to include new partners, such as the Safer Foundation and Tapestry Farms, increasing our community impact and introducing new audiences to the power of art.

In the upcoming year, the dedicated and talented Figge team of staff, trustees, and volunteers look forward to offering meaningful and can't miss experiences with world-class art and programs for people of all ages, backgrounds, and abilities; strengthening our commitment to diversity, equity, and inclusion; and forging stronger connections with all of you. We are immensely grateful for your continued support and valued contributions to the Figge Art Museum. Thank you for believing in the importance of art, its cultural and economic benefits to our community, and its ability to bring us together.


# Exhibition Highlights



### ROBERT BLACKBURN & MODERN AMERICAN PRINTMAKING OCTOBER 9, 2021 - JANUARY 9, 2022

Displayed on the Figge's third floor, *Robert Blackburn & Modern American Printmaking* celebrated a key artist in the development of printmaking in the twentieth century. An influential teacher and master printer, Blackburn promoted a new collaborative approach to the printmaking medium. The exhibition featured approximately 60 artworks, including lithographs, woodcuts, and watercolors, tracing Blackburn's artistic evolution from figurative work to highly colored abstraction alongside the art of his contemporaries. Works by Grace Hartigan, Elizabeth Catlett, Romare Bearden, and other iconic artists with whom he collaborated were also included.



### SIMPLE PLEASURES: THE ART OF DORIS LEE FEBRUARY 5, 2022 - MAY 8, 2022

The first major exhibition focusing on Aledo, Illinoisborn artist Doris Lee, *Simple Pleasures* featured over 70 works by the artist spanning the 1930s through the 1960s. Viewed as a homecoming by much of the community, the exhibition included paintings, lithographs, and a range of ephemera. Lee was one of the most recognized artists in the country during the 1930s and 1940s and a leading figure at the Woodstock Art Colony. By featuring early American Scene works to later abstracted imagery, *Simple Pleasures* demonstrated how Lee deftly merged abstraction with the appeal of the everyday.

### DIMENSIONAL: 3D WORKS FROM THE FIGGE COLLECTION SEPTEMBER 11, 2021 - JANUARY 16, 2022

Dimensional gave museum visitors the chance to explore rarely exhibited threedimensional works from the museum's collection as well as recent acquisitions by artists Vanessa German, John Ahearn, William Hawkins, and more. The 60 works on display ranged from wearable jewelry carved by artisans from the previous century all the way to contemporary assemblages created by living artists. These works were organized according to the four predominant methods of sculptural production - carving, modelling, casting, and assembly. This allowed for comparisons of technique across time periods and materials, creating an in-depth look at the evolution of sculptural practices through the lens of the museum's collection.

### BORDER CANTOS | SONIC BORDERS FEBRUARY 19, 2022 - JUNE 5, 2022

Displayed in the Figge's Katz Gallery, Border Cantos | Sonic Borders explored the complexities of the southern border through photography, sculpture, and sound. A collaboration between American photographer Richard Misrach and Mexican-American artist and composer Guillermo Galindo, the installation introduced distinct yet interrelated ways of experiencing the human consequences of immigration policies, encouraging empathy for the plight of migrants everywhere. The exhibition and a range of accompanying programming offered the Quad Cities community a vital opportunity to come together with empathy, understanding, and connection.

### **IMMIGRATION STORIES**

Figge Education Programs Coordinator Heather Aaronson worked closely with Black Hawk College's Multicultural and Inclusion Office to interview 10 students from 8 countries. ### CAMP FIGGE

The Figge welcomed 100 campers to Camp Figge: Art for Kids this past July. This series of week-long, half-day camps for kids in kindergarten through 8th grade engaged participants in a variety of hands-on projects. Students also had the chance to explore the galleries and learn first-hand from the art on view.

### SUNFLOWERS FOR UKRAINE

The Figge partnered with Gloria Burlingame (teaching artist) to host a special Wine and Art class called "Sunflowers for Ukraine." Participants learned how to paint sunflowers, the national flower of Ukraine and an international symbol of resistance against the invasion by Russia. Two sold-out classes took place and raised over \$1,000 for Ukrainian refugees in Poland.

### Outreach

Outreach allows the Figge to share its collections and exhibitions with people outside the museum. This year, the Figge worked with community partners, including schools, libraries, and other nonprofit organizations, to connect community members of all ages with art

### **Outreach Highlights**



### **HUMILITY SHELTER**

Each month, Figge outreach educators visit Humility Homes and Services, Inc. to engage shelter participants in art. Life situations can often be overwhelming, and these sessions provide a unique and easy way for individuals to release mental stress. In addition, as clients move from temporary housing into a permanent dwelling, they are provided with a Figge Art Kit. Filled with a variety of art supplies and journaling prompts, these kits offer an uplifting way for one to cope with the transition and sometimes unexpected feelings of living on their own. This year, we received funding to make 180 art kits.

### **IMMERSIVE OUTREACH**

This pilot program launched just as schools felt an increased demand to meet the social-emotional needs of students. Funded by the Windgate Foundation, this program brought Outreach Educator Laura Wriedt and a graduate assistant from the WIU Masters of Counseling program to work with students who were identified as needing extra support at Rock Island High School. The program had Wriedt visiting students' classrooms twice weekly with a monthly visit to the Figge, where they explored the museum and participated in artmaking on a deeper level. As the program progressed, students embraced life's challenges through art and felt comfortable creating a unique classroom space with their peers.





### **SPRING FORWARD**

The Figge Big Picture Outreach continues to serve as a year-round enrichment partner for Spring Forward both in their After-School/Intersession and Summer Learning programs. Each week, students are provided with new ways to explore learning through art. They learn about new artists through current exhibitions, explore art materials and challenge themselves in a creative way. Each season, they come to the Figge for a hands-on tour. For many students, this is a first-time visit, and for others, it is now a familiar and welcoming place for making art connections!


