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## **DIRECTOR'S LETTER**

Dear Friends,

What a summer we've had at the Figge! During the past few months, the Figge buzzed with energy, welcoming over 15,000 visitors to the museum during our Free Admission July alone. It was truly a wonderful sight to behold. As we transition from summer's warmth to the reflective embrace of fall, the museum evolves too. In a world of constant motion, the Figge offers a space where art becomes a conduit for personal wellness and community bonds. This season, we're thrilled to present a diverse collection of new exhibitions, classes, and events at the Figge, and we're eager to share these experiences with you.

September begins with *Quanta of Space: The Bosom Sculpture of Ibram Lassaw* in the Katz Gallery, an exhibition that captures the profound dialogue between the monumental and the personal. In the intricate metalwork of Ibram Lassaw's jewelry, we find the universe condensed into tactile treasures, reflecting both his abstract visions and his intrinsic connection to the cosmos. As September progresses, the Gildehaus Gallery and Mary Waterman Gildehaus Community Gallery come alive with *Day of the Dead: Remember, Honor, Celebrate,* drawing visitors into spaces enriched with tradition, culture, and heartfelt memories. As the *Day of the Dead* finds a broader resonance across borders and cultures, our galleries aim to be a sanctuary of storytelling, where the art of remembering is celebrated with both reverence and joy. *Zimoun* punctuates the month with an immersive space-specific installation in the Figge's third floor gallery, where 700 cardboard boxes set into motion challenge our senses to converge, conflict, and coalesce in a direct experience of sound making.



As leaves fall in October, we open *The Art and Activism of Tougaloo College*, a vivid testament to the power of art as an agent of change, reminding us of the transformative synergy between creativity and the relentless pursuit of equality. We're also eagerly anticipating a museum visit by internationally known artist Leo Villareal, who will be coming to do a preparatory installation for his public light sculpture *Evanescent Field*, which will be installed on all four sides of the Figge in 2025. As we transition into December, *Tradition Interrupted* reminds us that relics of our past can serve as catalysts for the innovations of the present, prompting us to ask: How can we honor our heritage while embracing the new? Meanwhile, the Gildehaus Gallery features *A Room That One Is In (And All Things In It)* by local artist and professor Peter Xiao. This exhibition questions how we perceive reality, how we inhabit space, and how the two are inextricably linked. In his first solo show, Xiao's "walk-around playground" offers a refreshingly tactile and embodied approach to art, reminding us that art is not just about seeing but also about feeling and experiencing.

Alongside these compelling exhibitions, our fall event calendar brims with both familiar favorites and new experiences. This Halloween, we invite you to embrace the spirit of the season with the Figge's Five Nights of Fright, October 25-29, featuring a chilling line-up of fun and creative events with all proceeds raised supporting the museum's mission to bring art and people together. In November, the much-anticipated Art Off the Wall returns with your chance to take home unique art pieces from over 100 artists. And our Museum Members are in for some exclusive treats this December with our annual Member Appreciation Week.

As you plan your fall activities, I encourage you to explore our class calendar, featuring new classes as well as seasonally inspired classes, like pumpkin painting, Halloween string art, holiday card making, felt ornament making, and more. Beyond these class offerings, remember that every Thursday night from 5:00 - 8:00 p.m. the Figge is free and open to the public, thanks to the continued generosity of Chris and Mary Rayburn. Our Thursday nights include a rotating schedule of free programming, including art talks, films, guided exhibition tours, and live performances. Let this fall be your personal canvas and join us at the Figge to experience the many ways art can transform your personal landscape and connect us all.

## **ART AND ACTIVISM AT TOUGALOO COLLEGE** Fourth Floor Gallery, October 7, 2023 - January 28, 2024

Since its founding in 1869 by the abolitionist-led American Missionary Association, Tougaloo College has made the fight for equality central to its mission. In 1963, the college became the center for modern art in Mississippi, when leaders of the New York art world began a rich program of art acquisitions to build the school's collection. Co-organized by the American Federation of the Arts and Tougaloo College, *Art and Activism at Tougaloo College* examines the birth and development of this unique collection—the first in Mississippi dedicated to modern art. Created as civil rights protests swirled across the fiercely segregated state, the collection was envisioned as "an interracial oasis in which the fine arts are the focus and the magnet." Comprising of approximately 33 artworks in a range of media by artists such as David Driskell, Elizabeth Catlett, Alma Thomas, Pablo Picasso, Richard Mayhew, Charles White, and Hale Woodruff, the exhibition gives insight into a complex American collection established at the intersections of modern art and social justice.

Art and Activism at Tougaloo College is organized by the American Federation of Arts and Tougaloo College. The exhibition is curated by Turry M. Flucker, Vice President of Collections and Partnerships at the Terra Foundation for American Art.

### **CURATOR INTERVIEW** WITH TURRY M. FLUCKER

### How do you feel that the Tougaloo collection is intertwined with the civil rights movement, and why do you think that connection is so compelling?

This collection is a significant story intertwined with the larger civil rights narrative. I would say more important than that—it is an American story. Tougaloo was at the center of the civil rights movement in Mississippi, and one could argue that it was at the center of the activity worldwide. Dore [Ashton] understood its importance as a laboratory for social change. She and the committee members founded the first modern art collection in Mississippi, where ALL could have access to fine art. That was monumental for 1963–and it continues to be significant and distinctive.

### In 1967, collecting efforts began to focus on African American works via the Tougaloo College Black Art Collection. What prompted those efforts?

The late 1960s brought about tremendous change for Tougaloo and for the country. The Black Power movement began to form on campuses across the county, and Professor [Ronald] Schnell saw this was a good opportunity to build a studio art program for the college, something that would align student interests. I think more importantly, it allowed for a balance of works within the collection.

#### Tougaloo has over 1500 works in its collection. How did you narrow it down to the 33 pieces featured in this exhibition?

I wanted to focus on the core works or works that came to the college between 1963 -1967 and to show works that were acquired with support from the National Endowment for the Arts in the early 1970s. I was interested in telling a story of solidarity and how the artists represented formed significant relationships with the college, and how they wanted to contribute to a cause greater than themselves.

#### What makes this exhibition, and the works in it, relevant now?


This exhibition is more relevant now than ever. It tells the story of a collective of people working in solidarity to advance humanity. This is the 60th anniversary and we are still polarized 60 years later. This exhibition reminds us that artists were listening and responding to what was happening in the 1960s, just as they were decades before.

### **ZIMOUN** Third Floor Gallery, September 23, 2023 - February 4, 2024

This fall, the Figge Art Museum will present a new, space-specific installation by the Swiss artist Zimoun. The installation includes over 80, 16-foot high cardboard stacks each set in motion mechanically. In addition to the strong visual aspect of numerous moving and jiggling cardboard towers, the movements will create a multitude of sounds and noises for visitors to contemplate. The sounds of scratching, scraping, rubbing, and clicking will fill the entire exhibition space. As visitors move around and inside the installation, the sounds and visual perspectives may be experienced in a variety of ways. What you hear is what you see and what you see is what you hear!

Though the installation's construction is very simple, the highly complex tonal and percussive behavior creates its own evocative sounds and rhythms which change throughout the day. Art lovers and engineers alike will be fascinated by the complex sounds emanating from the tower structures. Using very little electricity, the components of the installation are intended to be reusable and recyclable, generating little to no waste in its construction and operation.

Zimoun lives and works in Bern, Switzerland. His work has been presented internationally, recent displays of his work include exhibitions at the Museum Haus Konstruktiv Zurich; Museum of



Contemporary Art MAC Santiago de Chile; Nam June Paik Art Museum Seoul; Kuandu Museum Taipei; Art Museum Reina Sofia Madrid; Ringling Museum of Art, Florida; Mumbai City Museum; National Art Museum Beijing; and other prestigious museums.

In addition to his installation compositions, Zimoun also creates purely sound works which, like the installations, emerge from the artist's interest in creating auditory experiences composed of microscopically small sounds and noises. Zimoun's recordings are often designed for multi-channel sound systems. Through the implementation of multiple loudspeakers, listeners are placed within a three-dimensional sonic architecture that cannot be discovered visually, but only acoustically. Zimoun has collaborated on numerous recordings with both musicians and visual artists. Many of these recordings may be found on the Leerraum label, which he founded with graphic designer Marc Beekhuis in 2003.





### **QUANTA OF SPACE:** THE BOSOM SCULPTURE OF IBRAM LASSAW Katz Gallery, September 9 - December 3, 2023

emembered as one of the few pioneering Abstract Expressionist sculptors, Ibram Lassaw was less well known for his wearable sculptures, or "bosom sculptures," as he called them. Between 1951 and the late 1990s, Lassaw produced over 1,000 pieces of wearable art for family and friends. Created without drawings or plans, this extraordinary array of jewelry included pendants, necklaces, belt buckles, and broaches. Using unique combinations of metals as well as the techniques, colors, and forms found in his large-scale metal sculptures, his welded and brazed jewelry embody his interests in automatic drawing and surrealist impulses, incorporating his diverse interests in Zen Buddhism, cosmology, and quantum physics. These "bosom sculptures" allowed Lassaw's work to reach individual consumers, moving beyond museums and public spaces and into the private homes and lives of people. This is the first exhibition to focus on Lassaw's innovative "bosom sculpture." Quanta of Space features 36 unique examples of jewelry as well as nine of his signature sculptures created over a span of five decades. The exhibition will be accompanied by a fully illustrated catalogue that provides context to his life, his contributions to modernist studio jewelry at mid-century, and the forces that inspired him.




### **TRADITION INTERRUPTED** Katz Gallery, December 16, 2023 - March 31, 2024

Tradition Interrupted features a fascinating selection of 23 artworks created by 12 artists from around the world who believe that everyday objects have the power to evoke memories and emotions. Their works connect the past and the present by reimagining age-old art into exciting contemporary artworks. By applying new techniques and ideas to familiar items, like textiles, metals, and pottery, the artists tell their complex stories and challenge how we remember history.

Visual arts often act as a mirror, reflecting a culture's beliefs, values, and stories by providing insights into history and evolution. By reimagining traditional arts and crafts, the artists *interrupt* the fixed structure of history, allowing us to think differently about the past while envisioning new possibilities in the future.







his December, the Figge is pleased to welcome an installation of recent paintings by Peter T. Xiao, beloved local artist, and the Paul A. Anderson Chair in the Arts at Augustana College. This is Professor Xiao's first solo exhibition of work at the Figge. A student of art and art history, Xiao blends and bends Renaissance concepts of perspective and color and our evolving understanding of how we see the world around us. Through his paintings, he encourages us to explore the link between art and the world we inhabit. With his studio as inspiration, Xiao synthesizes the space which he inhabits onto painted views of multi-panel intersecting planes of canvas which wrap around corners and bend up to the ceiling. Including over 15 new large scale paintings, the Figge's first floor Gildehaus Gallery will be awash in a swirl of color and forms, providing us visual insight into his creative practice. Xiao describes the installation of paintings in this way "From walls and things that wrap around me, I explore modernist approaches to the picture plane." His floor painting Rise Ye Point, Line and Plane explores the idea of a chair (absent the sitter) and its dimensional "lift" through the viewer's associations with the chair's purpose. Xiao's innovative approach, a "walk-around playground" as he describes it, helps us to better understand the differences between how we see the world with our eyes and experience it with our bodies.

## **DAY OF THE DEAD:** REMEMBER, HONOR, CELEBRATE

### Gildehaus Gallery, September 16 - November 5, 2023 Mary Waterman Gildehaus Community Gallery, September 16 - December 3, 2023

N ot only does Day of the Dead have strong ties with our Hispanic community, it was declared a World Heritage Day by UNESCO in 2003, acknowledging the importance and strength of living heritage that is transmitted through community from generation to generation. What makes this traditional Mexican holiday so special? How has it taken on new meaning and proportions in the United States and beyond? This installation will explore how we as humans celebrate and remember the lives of our lost loved ones through the collective traditions, art-making, and story-telling that are integral parts of Día de los Muertos.

This year we feature several handmade works by Victor Granados, Martha Yesenia Granados, and their family members. This includes a newly crafted altar-piece. Also new to the exhibition this year is a series of Nicho boxes created by Rock Island High School students enrolled in the Figge's Big Picture Immersive Outreach Program. Inspired by the more ornate Roman Catholic Retablos, Nicho boxes utilize more humble materials such as cigar boxes made from wood, tin or, heavy cardboard, and are important to the Latin American tradition of remembering the deceased. These small, three-dimensional boxes are commonly placed on altars or ofrendas during Día de los Muertos.

A mobile audio tour, in-gallery activities, altar display, and Catrinas will all be a part of the ongoing celebration. The exhibition will also have bi-lingual didactics (English and Spanish).

## **NEW ACQUISITION** Wilderness: Light Sizzles Around Me

The Figge is pleased to announce the major acquisition of artist Lesley Dill's exhibition installation: *Wilderness: Light Sizzles Around Me*, a gift from the artist and the Nohra Haime Gallery. Comprising 15 personae in the form of large mixed media sculptures and stitched and painted banners, art historian and critic Nancy Princenthal has described *Wilderness* as a "textually clamorous, visually ravishing... story told in richly embroidered garments and in wall-spanning banners." For Dill, the installation created over a period of seven years represents the linguistic and visual weaving of 15 historical figures from the 16th to the 20th century and their unique relationships to the idea of "wilderness." Early settlers of what came to be called New England viewed the untamed and uncultivated wildness of the landscape as more the devil's world than their own; their impressions of this wilderness were guided more by fear of the unknown and the tenets of their faiths than a rational appreciation of nature or of the indigenous communities for whom the land had been home for millennia. With encouragement from the artist Jaune Quick-to-See Smith, the contemporary performance artist Dread Scott, and Juaquin Hamilton-YoungBird, historian for the Sac and Fox Nation, Dill's *Wilderness* reaches beyond outdated descriptions of the social and physical landscape from before and after the country's founding. The installation includes the voices of visionary activist Dred Scott, the Sauk warrior Black Hawk, and the abolitionist John Brown placed alongside other 18th and 19th century persona, such as the Shaker founder, Mother Ann Lee and the poet Emily Dickinson.

Lesley Dill (born 1950) is an American artist whose work blends words from the works of myriad poets and writers with fine art. Exploring the power of words to cloak and reveal the psyche, Dill invests new meaning in the human form. Metaphors, drawn from the poetry and writings of both historic and contemporary writers such as Emily Dickinson, Salvador Espriu, Tom Sleigh, Franz Kafka, Sister Gertrude Morgan, and John Brown, connect the diverse media that Dill employs. Paper, wire, horsehair, photography, foil, bronze, and music make up elements through which the artist conveys the complexities of communication. Dill is interested in drawing the viewer's attention to our societal histories found in linguistic relationships as well as an understanding of language itself. Her work is in the collections of over 50 museums, including the Metropolitan Museum of Art, the Museum of Modern Art in New York, and the Whitney Museum of American Art.

*Wilderness: Light Sizzles Around Me* first appeared at the Figge in summer 2021. Since then, the exhibition has been seen by more than 20,000 people in the places where it has traveled, including Alabama, Maine, Kansas, and New York.

## **DONOR SPOTLIGHT**

Stories of giving and impact

Whether you know him as a former educator in East Moline or a John Deere retiree, you know that Willie Ellis loves people and loves to support his community. Following numerous visits to the Figge in recent years, Willie has become a very active member of the museum community and a steadfast donor to support programs at the Figge benefiting the youth of the Quad Cities. "Students need the exposure to the vibrant culture, creativity, history, and diversity that is reflected at the Figge Art Museum," he states.

A native of Rockford, IL, Willie came to the Quad Cities following his studies at the University of Wisconsin-Stout, Northern Illinois University, and Western Illinois University-Quad Cities, spending a total of 14 years in education. He served as the Assistant Principal of United Township High School and Principal of the former Hoffman Elementary School in East Moline. Willie later taught at Ridgewood Elementary School in East Moline where he particularly enjoyed his experiences helping younger students. "My goal was to always create a positive experience for all students. Many times, I would sit on the floor with them during reading time with their teachers–anything I could do to help them feel more comfortable. I always thought if I could get students to love school, they'd have a great chance of being successful in the future."

Following his experiences in education, Willie worked for John Deere Seeding & Cylinder for the next 26 years. Not being the biggest fan of a "standard desk job," Willie jokingly tells us that his restlessness led to many opportunities of meeting countless talented individuals and employees in the plant during his tenure. During his career, he helped chaperone student trips through a partnership between John Deere and the Moline-Coal Valley Community School District. The partnership aimed to connect and encourage students in the subjects of math and science, but the trips also included visits to museums and cultural attractions, specifically the Art Institute of Chicago.

Willie remembers that it was through his own travels that he rediscovered his love for art, including landmark visits to Europe. During a particular trip to Paris (with hopes to see the Tour de France), Willie recalls, "I saw so much art in Paris, including all the masterpieces in the Louvre! I always had an appreciation for art, but I gained a greater interest from these trips."

When the Figge Art Museum opened in 2005, Willie was in the final years of his professional career. Since his retirement, he's been a frequent visitor here at the museum. And while he has seen and enjoyed many of the Figge's exhibitions, he particularly appreciated *Robert Blackburn & Modern American Printmaking* in late 2021. "The Figge provides so much enrichment to our entire community, giving students and their families a chance to see new views of the world and new aspects of creativity!"



I believe everyone should be a member of the Figge Art Museum! Members have such a rare and extraordinary opportunity in the Quad Cities to not only have free reign of the museum throughout the year but also have a chance to absorb and learn from a world-class institution right in our backyard!


